





JOINING CRITERIA

Rescue centres and sanctuaries must meet the following general criteria:

- ✓ Be a legal entity with the necessary national licence and/or permits.
- ✓ Provide humane and responsible care.
- ✓ Must not buy, sell, or trade animals.
- ✓ Work to ensure intake and outplacement helps to reduce reasons why animals need rescue.
- ✓ Work to prevent the need for rescue centres and sanctuaries, e.g. through education and involvement in conservation issues.
- ✓ Allow the public to visit only for educational purposes.Restrict physical contact between the public and animals.
- ✓ Do not conduct research if it compromises animal welfare or conservation.
- Prevent breeding.
- ✓ Conduct euthanasia only when there is no hope of reasonable recovery and quality of life.



EARS is a network that supports and represents rescue centres and sanctuaries across Europe, enabling them to work together to achieve mutual animal welfare and conservation goals.
